DAY OF YOUR PROCEDURE

Admissions

- A nurse will guide you through the admission.
- Provide the name and phone number of the responsible adult taking you home.
- For patients under 18, a parent or guardian must remain in the lobby during the entire stay.
- Family and friends may wait in the waiting room.
 They may be allowed to come in once you have been admitted, time permitting.

Anesthesia

 Sedation or anesthesia will be discussed with you prior to your procedure.

Recovery

- Nursing staff will care for you in the recovery area until you meet criteria to go home.
- It is normal to go home feeling drowsy.
- Visitors may be limited, to provide confidentiality for you or other patients.

Discharge Instructions

 Detailed written instructions will be provided and discussed in recovery.

WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER YOUR PROCEDURE

Possible Side Effects

- Most side effects are minor and decrease with time.
- You may experience dizziness and/or a sore throat.
- Temporary forgetfulness or memory loss is common due to the medication you received for the procedure.

Call Your Doctor if You Have

- **Uncontrolled Pain:** Severe pain that is unrelieved with medications. It is normal to have some discomfort after your procedure.
- Your doctor may recommend over the counter (OTC) and/or prescription medications.
- Follow your doctor's discharge instructions for other ways to relieve pain (For example: ice packs or elevation of surgical site).
- **Signs or Symptoms of Infection:** Fever (101 F or above), swelling, heat, drainage, or redness.
- Heavy Bleeding: Depending on your procedure, it may be normal to have small amounts of bleeding.
- Ongoing Nausea or Vomiting: Nausea and/or vomiting that lasts more than 24 hours. Small, light meals, taking medications with food, and staying hydrated may help.

At Home

- We strongly recommend you have a responsible adult with you at least 24 hours after your procedure.
- DO NOT: drive, operate machinery/tools, drink alcohol, use recreational drugs, or make important decisions for 24 hours.
- DO: follow all doctor's instructions.

Follow-Up Phone Call

 A nurse will call you the next business day to check on how you are doing. This is an opportunity to ask any questions.
