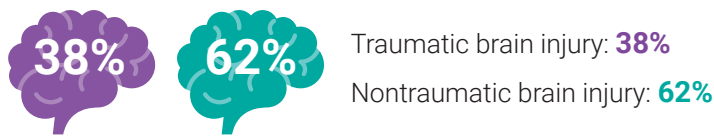


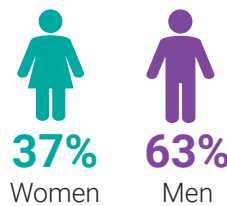
2025 Brain Injury Specialty Program Outcomes

Who We Serve

In 2025, we cared for 141 individuals with a brain injury. The average age was 63. The average length of stay was 14 days, compared with 12 days at units elsewhere in the country.



- **21%** were ages 18 to 44.
- **20%** were ages 45 to 64.
- **23%** were ages 65 to 74.
- **36%** were age 75 or older.



Follow-Up Reporting

Our patients receive a follow-up phone call three months after discharge to check in and see how they're doing in their community. "Durability of outcomes" reflects the real effectiveness of a rehabilitation program.

Our patients report durability of outcomes that far exceed national benchmarks.

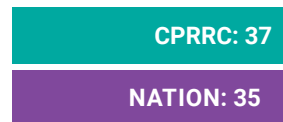
CPRRC is accredited by Joint Commission and the Commission on the Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

Committed to Quality

Improvement in an individual's ability to move independently and take care of themselves after a brain injury allows them to return to their home, community and life.

Quality indicator (QI) scores reflect performance on a composite of seven self-care tasks and 15 mobility tasks. Our patients consistently make greater improvement compared with similar patients discharged from other facilities in the nation.

Self-care: Discharge QI



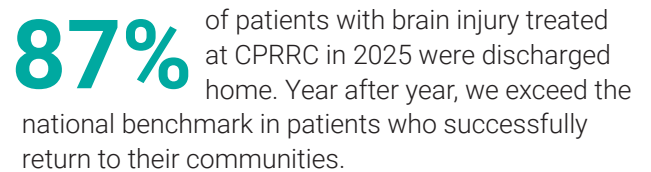
Mobility: Discharge QI



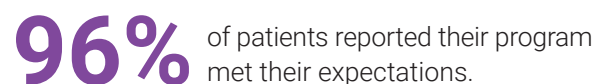
